

Minutes of the regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Huntington Park held Monday, April 16, 2012.

Following the Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, the meeting was called to order in the Council Chambers at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Molina. Present: Council Member Mario Gomez, Vice Mayor Elba Guerrero, Council Member Ofelia Hernandez, Council Member Rosa E. Perez, and Mayor Andy Molina; Absent: None.

Mario Rivas, Recycling Coordinator, informed City Council of the purpose of City's Annual Earth Day poster contest and that this year's theme is "Be Clean and Green". Mayor Molina and City Council presented Certificates of Achievement to the following students for winning the City's Annual Earth Day 2012 Poster Contest: Category I: 3rd Place: Jordan Fernandez, 1st Grade student at Huntington Park Elementary School; 2nd Place: Melissa Mariscal, 1st Grade student at Aspire Elementary School; 1st Place: Ashley Vazquez, 1st Grade student at Aspire Elementary School; Category II: 3rd Place: Ilianna Barraza, 3rd Grade student at Huntington Park Elementary School; 2nd Place: Nicole Soto, 2nd Grade student at Huntington Park Elementary School; 1st Place: Yahliil Villa, 2nd Grade student at Huntington Park Elementary School; Category III: 3rd Place: Alexia Galicia, 5th Grade student at Huntington Park Elementary School; 2nd Place: Noemy Chavez, 4th Grade student at Middleton Elementary School (not present); and 1st Place: Samantha Saldoval, 5th Grade student at Pacific Boulevard Elementary School.

Mayor Molina and City Council presented a Proclamation to Nick M. Ioannidis, founder of National Immigrants Day, in celebration of his 37th Anniversary as a United States citizen and designating October 28th as "National Immigrants Day". Mr. Ioannidis thanked City Council for the recognition and stated that he will be celebrating his 37th Anniversary of citizenship at 2669 E. Gage Avenue on Saturday, April 21, 2012 from 12:00 p.m. to 1:30 p.m.

Mayor Molina and City Council presented a Proclamation to Sandra Orozco for the Multiple Sclerosis Association of America (MSAA) in recognition, understanding and support of those individuals whose lives are affected by Multiple Sclerosis (MS) and to create awareness in the City of Huntington Park. Ms. Orozco thanked Mayor Molina, City Council and Interim City Manager Romero for supporting MSAA and informed City Council that her goal is for the southeast cities to adopt similar proclamations in recognition of Multiple Sclerosis to take to Sacramento officials.

Mayor Molina and City Council presented a Proclamation recognizing April 2012 as Sexual Assault Awareness Month and April 25, 2012 as Denim Day in the City of Huntington Park.

Mayor Molina opened oral communications, indicating that this was the time for anyone in the audience to address the City Council on any matter of City business.

Balle Dario Machuca addressed City Council to remind them that there is still a parking problem for residents in the City and informed City Council that he met with the Chief of Police and the Traffic Authority to address this matter and that the Traffic Authority recommended that the curb in front of apartment at 6618 Seville Avenue be painted green with twenty (20) minute loading or unloading from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Mr. Machuca informed City Council that offering a 20 minute parking zone is not the solution and asked City Council for a better solution. Mr. Machuca proposed that the City consider designating residential parking only on residential streets to help remedy the problem and recommended that City staff look into other cities that currently have residential parking zones to consider doing the same in the City of Huntington Park. Interim City Manager Romero informed City Council that the Traffic Authority met last week and that an extensive study was done by a traffic engineer which provided direction as to what could be done to help Mr. Machuca but that unfortunately Mr. Machuca finds the solution of a 20 minute parking zone unsatisfactory. Chief of Police Cisneros informed City Council that Mr. Machuca was informed that zoning issues must be addressed to the Planning Division and not the Traffic Authority. Mr. Machuca asked if the Police Department could stop issuing citations until the City finds a better solution.

Enrique Murillo informed City Council that he was appointed as a commissioner by City Council and that due to circumstances the Interim City Manager removed him from the commission. Mr. Murillo asked City Council if the Interim City Manager is authorized to remove him from the commission and asked if City Council was aware of this. Mr. Murillo asked City Council to consider putting someone else in the position of City Manager.

Christopher Becerra informed City Council that he has experienced the lack of parking on Seville Avenue and stated that he has lived in the same place for over 15 years and has

experienced the same parking issue as Mr. Machuca. Mr. Becerra informed City Council that he pays an average of \$1,300 a year in parking citations and left a copy of a notice of outstanding parking tickets. Mr. Becerra also informed City Council that residents have to compete for parking with merchants and employees of the businesses in the area. Mr. Becerra stated that there is a public parking lot on Rita Avenue but it is not supervised and due to recent vehicle thefts at this parking lot, he does not want to risk parking his vehicle there. Mr. Becerra also informed City Council that approximately 2-3 parking spaces have been removed from each block therefore increasing the parking deficit for residents and asked City Council for assistance with this matter.

Don Brabant, President of The Greater Huntington Park Area Chamber of Commerce, thanked City Council for approving the 19th Annual Carnaval Primavera Downtown Festival on April 13-15, 2012. Mr. Brabant informed City Council that they cancelled the event on Friday, April 13, 2012 due to the rain, but resumed on Saturday to celebrate Kids Day and stated that there was one minor incident involving a business license but overall, the event was successful.

Janine Hamner, Community Relations Manager with Waste Management, informed City Council that in efforts to keep the City Clean, Waste Management in collaboration with the City will be having a litter clean-up in which students from Pacific Elementary School will be volunteering to clean litter on April 28, 2012. Ms. Hamner also informed City Council that at the end of last month, Waste Management was recognized by the Ethisphere Institution as the "2012 World's Most Ethical Companies" for the 5th consecutive year.

Alex Young addressed his concern to City Council regarding the waiver of fees associated with events in the City, especially during the City's financial crisis and asked City Council to consider securing a bond from organizations prior to having an event to ensure that the City is reimbursed for expenses.

Mayor Molina called for any other oral communications, and hearing none, declared oral communications closed.

City Clerk Ramirez announced that in accordance with published notice, this is the time and place set to consider the adoption of an ordinance amending the Huntington Park Municipal Code regulations applicable to signs within the General Commercial (C-G) Zone. The City Clerk reported that no written communications had been received in the Office of the City Clerk. Mayor Molina declared the public hearing open and called for oral communications. Interim Director of Community Development Wong informed City Council that City staff met with the applicant of a particular business and after reviewing the Huntington Park Municipal Code (HPMC), staff concluded that the HPMC needed to be updated to allow more than one (1) sign and graphics per building frontage within the General Commercial Zone on Florence, Santa Fe and Slauson Avenues. Anthony Oliver, Chief Operating Officer with WSS (Warehouse Shoe Sale), informed City Council that WSS has been in business for over 28 years and that they are interested in opening more stores, including a mega store in the City of Huntington Park, which would be the largest in square footage of any of their current stores and asked City Council to consider approving the zone amendment by adopting the proposed ordinance. Mr. Oliver informed City Council that WSS expects to open this store later this year preferably before the holidays. William Argueta, Vice President of Retail of WSS (Warehouse Shoe Sale), informed City Council that WSS is looking forward to opening the proposed mega store, which will be the largest store in the company as well as the most anticipated revenue generating store. Mr. Argueta thanked the Planning Department for working with WSS and helping with the new look and design of the proposed store. Mayor Molina called for any other oral communications and hearing none, Mayor Molina declared the **public hearing** closed.

standards. The City Clerk announced that due to a typographical error, there is a noted correction to Page 2, Line 13 which should read “June 6, 2011” not June 6, 2012 of this proposed Interim Urgency Ordinance and reported that no written communications had been received in the Office of the City Clerk. Mayor Molina declared the public hearing open and called for oral communications and hearing none, Mayor Molina declared the **public hearing** closed.
