

**Minutes of the Meeting of the City of Huntington Park
Health and Education Commission
held May 22, 2006**

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. present: Commissioners Jorge Morales, Arlene Savage, and Chairman Ric Loya. Also in attendance were Councilmember Ofelia Hernandez, Assistant Planner Alberto Fontanez, and Recording Secretary Corinna Luevano. Absent: Commissioners Joe Englanoff and Vice Chair Rosa Perez.

Minutes of the Regular Meeting held on April 24, 2006:

A motion was made by Commissioner Morales, seconded by Commissioner Savage, to approve the minutes of the meeting held on April 24, 2006. The motion was unanimous.

Discussion and/or action on the city of Los Angeles' latest move to assume control of the Los Angeles Unified School District:

Councilmember Hernandez informed the Commissioners that there are on going studies with the community to decide what steps to take, should the city of Los Angeles take control of District 6. Councilmember Hernandez added that they are looking into a Joint Power Agreement with the City of Los Angeles, to participate in the budget process and the selection of the Superintendent for District 6.

Recording Secretary Corinna Luevano stated that she received a call from Mayor Villaraigosa's office that they were inquiring if the Commission was still seeking a representative on behalf of the Mayor to discuss this item. Ms. Luevano replied yes and that they would try to have someone from their office attend the meeting; however, no one was present to address the Commissioners.

Status of New School Development in the City of Huntington Park:

David Santana, District 5, Los Angeles Unified School District, 333 South Beaudry Avenue, 24th Floor, Los Angeles, California 90017, was present to reveal the updated model of the proposed new High School on the west side of Huntington Park.

A motion was made by Savage, seconded by Morales, to submit to the City Council their support of the Los Angeles Unified School Districts' architectural layout for the proposed new High School #7, as well as naming the school after the Honorable Marco A. Firebaugh. The motion was unanimous.

Discussion and/or action on the Binational Health Week in September 2006:

A motion was made by Savage, seconded by Morales, to request from the City Council, approval to conduct a Health Fair in conjunction with the El Grito event scheduled for September 16, 2006. The motion was unanimous.

Discussion and/or Action on the status of the new name for the new elementary school on State Street:

Chairman Loya requested that this item be continued to the next meeting.

Discussion and/or Action on the 5 Cities, 5-a-Day, New Years Resolution campaign:

Chairman Loya requested that this item be continued to the next meeting.

Status of Community and Mission Hospitals:

Chairman Loya stated that Community Hospital is being repainted and that Mission Hospital is soon to follow.

Chairman Loya stated that the next Health and Education meeting scheduled for June 26, 2006, will be held at All Care Medical Group.
