**CITY ATTORNEY'S ANALYSIS OF CITY OF HUNTINGTON  
PARK PROPOSITION A RELATING TO AMENDMENT OF  
RETIREMENT SYSTEM FOR SAFETY (POLICE) EMPLOYEES**

Approval of this Measure would direct the City Council to amend existing Public Employees Retirement System contract to provide benefits to safety (police) employees as follows:

(a) Discretionary retirement at age 50, with compulsory retirement at age 60. Present contract provides for discretionary retirement at age 50 with reduced benefits, normal retirement at age 55 and compulsory retirement at age 65. This proposition would lower the minimum and the compulsory retirement ages and increase retirement costs, inasmuch as payments would be made to retired employees over a longer period of time.

(b) Retirement pay based upon 2% of compensation for each year of service, but not to exceed 75% of final compensation. Present contract provides for retirement pay equal to one-half of salary at age 55, if employee works a minimum of 20 years, with additional pay if more than 20 years if worked.

(c) Retirement pay to be based upon highest one year's compensation compared with present system of basing retirement pay upon average of the highest three years of compensation. Costs would increase because a higher base would be used to figure retirement benefits. City would pay entire cost of this benefit.

(d) Widow's allowance equal to one-half of the employee's retirement benefit. City would pay entire cost of this benefit. Present system provides no widow's allowance, so retirement costs would necessarily increase to cover such additional retirement payments.

(e) Cost Analysis. Funds for the proposed retirement program, as with the present program, would be raised from real property taxes only. Based upon information provided by the Actuary for the Retirement System and upon payroll figures furnished by the City Clerk, a comparison of estimated costs for the proposed system and present system are as follows:

## ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF PROPOSITION "A"

Officers, who do not receive Social Security benefits, will contribute 9% of their salary to the retirement program.

The safety of the officers, and naturally the citizens, will be increased by a retirement program which has the effect of causing vital police functions to be performed by younger and more versatile officers.

Most important to each officer and his family is the provision in PROPOSITION "A" that allows his widow and orphans to receive one half of his earned pension benefits upon his death.

We know that the total benefits flowing to the community from the passage of this proposition will greatly outweigh any costs involved.

Approval of this Measure would direct the City Council to amend existing Public Employees Retirement System Contract to provide additional retirement benefits to miscellaneous employees (meaning all other than police) as follows:

(a) Retirement compensation to be based upon highest one year's salary, compared with present system of basing retirement pay upon an average of the highest three years' pay. City would pay entire cost of this benefit.

Costs would increase because a higher base would be used to figure retirement payment if the highest one year is used, rather than an average of three years.

(b) Widow's allowance equal to one-half of the employee's retirement benefit. City would pay entire cost of this benefit. Present system provides no widow's allowance, so retirement costs would necessarily increase to cover such additional retirement payments.

(c) Cost Analysis. Funds for the proposed retirement program, as with the present program, would be raised from real property taxes only. Based upon information provided by the Actuary for the Retirement System and upon payroll figures furnished by the City Clerk, a comparison of estimated costs for the proposed system and present system are as follows:

## ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF PROPOSITION "B"

Passage of Proposition "B" is needed if the employees of our city are to enjoy the fruits of their labor in their later years as do those who work in private industry.

The current retirement plan was put into effect about thirty (30) years ago and needs to be updated to reflect the changing inflationary times.

People in private industry have Unemployment Benefits. City employees do not.

People in private industry are covered by Social Security. City employees are not.

People in private industry have Disability Insurance; (for off the job sicknesses) City employees do not.

City employees pay their fair share of the retirement plans cost. They pay 7% of their pay towards this cost.

City employees pay property taxes which help the city pay it's share of the cost.

The cost of Proposition "B" is not an exorbitant amount of money to the taxpayers. It would amount to three dollars and seventy four cents (3.74) on a home with a market value of sixteen thousand four hundred dollars (\$16,400).
