HP LAUNCHES SUMMER YOUTH EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM

The City of Huntington Park and the HUB Cities Worksource Consortium have launched the Youth Summer Employment and Civic Engagement Program.

This new pilot program is partially supported by Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds. CDBG funds are intended for economic development programs to support existing businesses with technical assistance and job creation.

This program is designed as a 7-week summer employment program in which twelve Huntington Park residents, ages 16-18, will be selected by a competitive application process on May 17, 2016. Participants will work 16 hours a week from July 5 – August 19, 2016 and will receive a new laptop, plus a stipend up to \$1,000 at the completion of the program.

The program will prepare participants to become workforce ready by providing city youth with technical skills and work experience within City departments and

local businesses. The program will include comprehensive education, employment preparation, supportive service, and leadership development. As part of their experience, participants will complete a water conservation project in June as a community benefit project. The recipients of this project will be twelve low income Huntington Park senior citizen (65 years of age and older) homeowners who will get free water-wise toilets installed.

Program participants will end their work experience by attending a University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA) UniCamp. The UniCamp is a one week team-building experience in a camping environment.

In order to be eligible for the program, all youth applicants and participants must:

- Live within the City of Huntington Park;
- Be a Huntington Park high school junior, senior or registered college freshman attending a local community college, ages 16-18;

- Have the legal right to work in the United States (DACA students accepted);
- Be comfortable working in teams of two and in larger groups;
- Be available to work 4 hours a day (10:00 am – 2:00 pm), Monday – Thursday;
- Be available to volunteer with a team after work hours for community benefit project;
- Attend weekly lunch workshop seminar sessions;
- Attend May, 2016 Pre-orientation and participate with all 7 weeks of program;
- Be available to participate August 7 – 14, 2016 UCLA UniCamp, week-long away camp program;

Applications are available at the office of the City Clerk or can be downloaded at the city's website: www.hpca.gov. Applications will be accepted and must be submitted by April 18, 2016 at 5:00 pm to the Office of the City Clerk, City Hall, 6550 Miles Avenue, Huntington Park, CA 90255.

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THE HP EXPRESS ARRIVES

The City of Huntington Park recently unveiled the Huntington Park Express, previously called COMBI.

The HP Express operates every day of the year, except on the following holidays: Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Years, and Labor Day. The Express runs on a Saturday schedule for President's Day, Memorial Day, and Independence Day.

The fare for general admission is \$0.75 and TAP/Access cards are acceptable forms of payment. Persons, 62 years of age and older with a Senior photo ID or Senior Metro (MTA) bus pass, disabled persons

with valid ID, Medicare holders with valid ID, and children under 4 years of age can ride free on the Express.

Service operates 6:00 am—6:30 pm, Monday through Friday and 8:00 am—5:30 pm on Saturday, approximately every 25 minutes. The HP Express does not run on Sundays.

CICLAVIA IS COMING!

Bikes, skates, or your own two feet. Whatever method of transportation, residents in Huntington Park and neighboring areas are invited to take advantage of the open streets during CicLAvia.

CicLAvia transforms the streets of cities into safe spaces for thousands of people to bike, walk, play, and enjoy all of the activities that are offered. Three years in the making, CicLAvia: Southeast Cities is a 10 mile route that passes through Huntington Park, Watts, South Gate, Lynwood, and the surrounding LA County areas. In addition, five hubs within the route

will feature free live entertainment, fitness classes, giveaways, and more. The hub for Huntington Park will be located at Pacific Blvd and Zoe Ave.

Streets along the route will be closed off to motorized vehicles and parking will not be permitted. Residents will be advised to move their vehicles to avoid towing costs.

HP AND THE ENVIRONMENT



The City of Huntington Park Public Works Department is pleased to announce a series of community events that help to benefit the environment. These events benefit the environment and the community by helping to eliminate litter debris from sidewalks, street curbs, and storm drains. In addition, these events help educate residents on proper disposal techniques.

By helping to clean up litter on the streets, the community helps to facilitate the water flow into the storm drains on rainy days. On rainy days, storm drain water runoff along with trash in the streets goes directly into the ocean where it affects marine life. Residents can help prevent litter from ending up in

the Los Angeles River or Pacific Ocean by properly disposing of trash. Litter belongs in the trash and not in a storm drain, river, or the ocean.

The City of Huntington Park also encourages the recycling of used motor oil and filters by partnering with local businesses that accept and recycle used oil and used oil filters. City sponsored used oil events are an ideal way to recycle used oil and filters. Residents that bring an old oil filter to recycle will receive a coupon for a new free oil filter! There's a limit of three coupons per resident on event days only.

Recycling used motor oil conserves a natural resource (oil) and is good for the environment too. Motor oil poured onto the ground or into a storm drain, or tossed into a trash can (even in a sealed container) can contaminate and pollute the soil, groundwater, streams, and rivers. Recycling your used motor oil reduces this pollution threat.

HP LANZA PROGRAMA DE EMPLEO JUVENIL DE VERANO

La Ciudad de Huntington Park y el consorcio HUB Cities Worksource lanzan el programa de empleo juvenil de verano y participación cívica.

El programa de empleo juvenil es un programa piloto financiado en parte con "Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)". Los fondos del programa CDBG, son destinados a programas de desarrollo económico que ayudan a negocios actuales con asistencia técnica y creación de empleos.

El programa de empleo de verano esta designado a un plazo de 7 semanas de empleo juvenil en el cual 12 residentes de Huntington Park entre los 16 a los 18 años de edad serán seleccionados el 17 Mayo del 2016, mediante un proceso de solicitud competitivo. Los participantes trabajaran 16 horas por semana comenzando el 5 de Julio hasta el 19 de Agosto del 2016, y recibirán una computadora portatil, como también un estipendio de hasta \$1,000 al final del programa.

El programa preparara a los participantes a estar listos para la fuerza laboral proporcionando a los jóvenes con habilidades técnicas y experiencia de trabajo con los

departamentos de la ciudad y empresas locales. El programa incluirá educación comprensiva, preparación de empleo, servicio de apoyo y el desarrollo de liderazgo. Como parte de la experiencia veraniega, los participantes completarán en Junio un proyecto de conservación del agua como beneficio comunitario. Los beneficiarios de este proyecto serán doce (12) personas de la tercera edad (mayores de 65 años) residentes de Huntington Park, de bajos recursos, propietarios de sus viviendas que reciban inodoros que ayudan a conservar agua completamente gratis.

Los participantes del programa terminaran su experiencia laboral asistiendo al programa de la Universidad de California, en Los Angeles (UCLA) Unicampamento. Este programa de Unicampamento es una semana formentando el espíritu en equipo en un ambiente de campamento.

Para ser elegible a el programa, los jovenes y participantes deben:

- Vivir dentro de la ciudad de Huntington Park;
- Ser estudiante de una preparatoria en Huntington Park, y cursar el tercer, o cuarto año, o estudiante

matriculado en un colegio comunitario, entre los 16-18 años de edad;

- Tener derecho legal para trabajar en los Estados Unidos (Estudiantes de DACA son aceptados);
- Poder trabajar confortable en equipos de dos y en grupos grandes ;
- Estar disponible para trabajar 4 horas al día (de 10:00 am - 2:00 pm) de lunes a jueves;
- Estar disponible a hacer trabajo voluntario con equipo despues del horario de trabajo para beneficio del proyecto comunitario;
- Asistir a talleres semanales durante el almuerzo;
- Asistir a la pre-orientación en Mayo del 2016, y participar las 7 semanas del programa;
- Estar disponible para participar Agosto 7-14, 2016 en el programa UCLA Unicampamento, con una semana de duración fuera de casa.

HP EXPRESS YA ESTA EN CIRCULACIÓN

La ciudad de Huntington Park inauguró recientemente el autobus Huntington Park Express, conocido anteriormente como COMBI.

El autobus HP Express circula todos los dias del año, excepto en los siguientes días feriados: Día de Acción de Gracias, Navidad, Año Nuevo y Día del Trabajo. El HP Express circula en el horario de sábados para el Día de los Presidentes, Día de Recordacion y el Día de la Independencia.

La tarifa de transporte es de \$ 0.75 y las tarjetas TAP / Access son formas aceptables de pago. Personas de 62 años de edad con identificacion con foto o el pase de transportacion de Metro (MTA), las personas discapacitadas con identificacion valida, personal con tarjeta de Medicare válida, y menores de 4 años de edad pueden viajar gratis en el HP Express.

Las horas de circulacion son de 6:00 am - 6:30 pm, de Lunes a Viernes, y de 8:00 am - 5:30 pm los sabados, el autobus circula aproximadamente cada 25 minutos. El HP Express no esta en circulacion los domingos.

HP Y EL MEDIO AMBIENTE



La ciudad de Huntington Park y el departamento de obras públicas se complacen en anunciar una serie de eventos comunitarios que le ayudan a beneficiar al medio ambiente. Estos eventos benefician el medio ambiente y a la comunidad, ayudando a eliminar desechos de basura de las banquetas, aceras y alcantarillas. Además, estos eventos ayudaran a educar a los residentes sobre la eliminacion de desechos apropiados.

Ayudando a limpiar los desechos de las calles, la comunidad ayuda a facilitar el flujo de agua en las alcantarillas durante los días de lluvia. En días de lluvia, el agua que corre con basura de las calles hacia a las alcantarillas va directamente al océano donde afecta la vida marina. Los residentes pueden ayudar a prevenir que la basura termine en el río de Los Ángeles, o en el Océano Pacífico desechando la basura

apropiadamente. Los desperdicios pertenecen en la basura y no en las alcantarillas, los ríos o el océano.

La ciudad de Huntington Park también recomienda el reciclaje de aceite usado automotriz y filtros mediante con una asociación de negocios locales que aceptan y reciclarán aceite y filtros de aceite usados. Eventos de reciclaje patrocinados por la Ciudad son la manera ideal de reciclar aceite usado y filtros. Los residentes que traigan un filtro de aceite viejo recibirán un cupón para obtener un filtro de aceite nuevo! Hay un límite de tres cupones por residente disponibles solo en los días de los eventos.

Reciclar aceite usado automotoriz conserva un recurso natural (aceite) y también es bueno para el medio ambiente. Aceite automotriz tirado en el piso, dentro de las alcantarillas o tirado en un bote de basura (aunque esten en contenedores sellados) puede contaminar la tierra, aguas subterráneas, arroyos y ríos. Al reciclar su aceite de motor usado disminuye la amenaza de contaminación.

No es necesario confirmar su asistencia para eventos de limpieza. Todos los materiales y equipo de seguridad seran proporcionados. PlanHP AND THE FUTURE OF HP

PlanHP is a community initiative to update the City's General Plan and discovering a shared vision for the future of Huntington Park.

What is a general plan update?

California state law requires every city and county to prepare a comprehensive, long-term general plan to guide its future, known as the General Plan. The General Plan has been called the “blueprint for future development”, because it contains goals and policies necessary to guide public policy for future land uses.

Why Update the General Plan?

In order to remain effective, the General Plan typically needs to be updated every 10 to 20 years to:

- Identify the community's goals and policies as they relate to land use and development.
- Provide a basis for local government decision-making, including decisions on development.
- Provide citizens with opportunities to participate in the planning and decision-making processes of their communities.
- Inform citizens, developers, decision-makers, and other cities and counties of the ground rules that guide development within a particular community.

PlanHP Y EL FUTURO DE HP

¿Que es la actualización de el plan general?

La ley del estado de California requiere que cada ciudad y condado preparen un plan general comprensivo y de largo termino conocido como el Plan General. El Plan General se ha llamado “El plano para desarrollos futuros”, porque incluye metas y políticas necesarias para ser usadas como guías de reglas públicas para usos de terrenos en el futuro.

- Informa a residentes, inmobiliarios, encargados, otras ciudades y condados del proceso de las reglas básicas que guían el desarrollo dentro de sus comunidades.

UPDATES TO DIAL-A-RIDE

As of January 1, 2016, several updates have been made to the Dial-A-Ride service.

Huntington Park residents must be 65 years of age or older in order to enroll in the program. There is no change in enrollment for residents registered with the program prior to January 1, 2016.

The program will operate from 5:00 am to 10:00 pm, Monday through Friday and 7:00 am to 11 am on Sunday. The participant's share of the trip cost is now \$1.00, payable to the taxi driver. Each participant is entitled to a maximum of 20 trips per month.

The taxicab service travels anywhere within the Huntington Park city boundaries and to specific

satellite locations outside of Huntington Park. Passengers must pay cash for trips beyond the city limits boundary of the program if the trips do not start or end from a satellite point.

Huntington Park. Los pasajeros deben pagar en efectivo por viajes más allá del límite de la ciudad si los viajes no empiezan o terminan en un punto satelite.
