Huntington Park Welcomes H.P RoboCop

On Tuesday June 18, 2019, "HP RoboCop" was introduced into Huntington Park's police force signaling a new era in public safety and policing service. "HP RoboCop" was recently previewed at Huntington Park's 5K in May at Salt Lake Park and has been diligently patrolling the park since. HP RoboCop charms community members and provides added value to park safety.



"HP Robocop" is an autonomous sophisticated data machine that is meant to serve outdoors. It will act as an extra set of eyes and monitor areas such as parks, city buildings and corridors where police might not have the time to consistently patrol. It will serve as a deterrent to crime and disruptive activity and also provide the police force with 360-degree HD video footage. HP RoboCop also has other technology features that will prove to be beneficial in day-to-day operations and follow-up investigations.

Mayor Karina Macias stated: "I'm very excited that we can officially call on HP RoboCop to help our police officers patrol our city. This is a big accomplishment for our city and introducing HP RoboCop shows innovation and the incorporation of new technology. I am certainly impressed with HP RoboCop and can't wait to see the public safety benefits it will bring to our community." Police Chief Cosme Lozano had the following statement: "The police department is proud to welcome HP RoboCop as an official member of the police force," he added, "the extra help will definitely give the officers more time to focus on other community issues. I am confident he will fit right in."



"HP RoboCop's capabilities are extremely impressive," said City Manager Ricardo Reyes. "In particular its ability to use its microphone to deter criminal activity and its mobility to patrol large open spaces." Knight Scope was originally founded in response to the tragic events at Sandy Hook and the Boston Marathon. The founders believed that with a unique combination of hardware, software and humans, they could greatly reduce crime. Mandatory Commercial Organics Recycling (AB 1826)

In October of 2014 Governor Brown signed AB 1826 Chesbro (Chapter 727, Statutes of 2014), requiring businesses to recycle their organic waste on and after April 1, 2016, depending on the amount of waste they generate per week. This law also requires that on and after January 1, 2016, local jurisdictions across the state implement an organic waste recycling program to divert organic waste generated by businesses, including multifamily residential dwellings that consist of five or more units (please note, however, that, multifamily dwellings are not required to have a food waste diversion program).

Why Organics? Mandatory recycling of organic waste is the next step toward achieving California's aggressive recycling and greenhouse gas (GHG) emission goals. California disposes approximately 30 million tons of waste in landfills each year, of which more than 30 percent could be used for compost or mulch (see the 2008 Waste Characterization Study). Organic waste such as green materials and food materials are recyclable through composting and mulching, and through anaerobic digestion, which can produce renewable energy and fuel. The City of Huntington Park is in the process of developing programs that will address the requirements as set forth in AB 1826.

Proper Steps to Take when Discarding of Bulky Items

Bulky items can consist of mattresses, sofas, refrigerators, TV's or any household items.

- To make arrangements to have these items collected please call CR&R at **562-968-1759** Monday-Friday 8am to 5pm
- Call at least **ONE DAY BEFORE** your regular collection day. Please have a list of items ready before calling in the request.
- Unless you have received a citation from the code enforcement, we will pick up your items on your service day. **Please do not put them out sooner.**

Report Illegal Dumping

Illegal dumping items are unclaimed material which are deposited at the curbside, in alleys or abandoned on streets. CR&R will pick up most illegal dumped and unclaimed material.

Census 2020 Censo

The 2020 Census is closer than you think! Here's a quick refresher of what it is and why it is essential that everyone is counted.

Everyone counts

The census counts every person living in the US, only once, and in the right place.

It is about fair representation

Every 10 years, the results of the census are used to reapportion the House of Representatives, determining how many seats each state gets.

It is in the Constitution

The U.S. Constitution requires a census every 10 years. The census covers the entire country and everyone living here.

The first census was in 1790.

It means \$675 billion

Census data determine how more than \$675 billion are spent, supporting your state, county and community's vital programs.

It is about Redistricting

After each census, state officials use the results to redraw the boundaries of their congressional and state legislative districts, adapting to population shifts.

Taking part is your civic duty

Completing the census is required: it's a way to participate in our democracy and say "I COUNT!"

Census day will be April 1, 2020. You will be able to respond online, by phone, or by mail. For more information, go to census.gov

Todos cuentan

El censo cuenta a cada persona que vive en los Estados Unidos de America, solo una vez, y en el lugar correcto.

Se trata de una representacion justa

Cada 10 años, los resultados del censo se utilizan para redistribuir la Cámara de Representantes, determinando cuántos representantes obtiene cada estado.

Esta en la constitucion

La Constitución de los Estados Unidos de America requiere un censo cada 10 años. El censo cubre todo el país y todos los que viven aquí. El primer censo fue en 1790.

Significa \$675 Mil Millones

Los datos del censo determinan cómo se gastan más de \$ 675 mil millones, apoyando los programas vitales de su estado, condado y comunidad.

Se trata de redistribución de distritos

Después de cada censo, los funcionarios estatales utilizan los resultados para volver a dibujar los límites de sus distritos legislativos del Congreso y del estado, adaptándose a los cambios de población.

Tomar parte es tu deber cívico

Se requiere completar el censo: es una forma de participar en nuestra democracia y decir "¡YO CUENTO!"
