HP RoboCop Credited for Reducing Crime

It has been a year since HP RoboCop started patrolling Salt Lake Park on a 24/7 schedule.

With the help of HP RoboCop, police activity has diminished at Salt Lake Park. In the last 6 months of 2019, the police department recorded 249 entries.

This is a 10% reduction compared to the same time period in 2018.

The data analyzed also showed the following results;

46% reduction in crime reports

68% reduction in citations

27% increase in arrests

The Huntington Park Police Department surmised that HP RoboCop is having a positive impact on crime and undesired activity at Salt Lake Park and the surrounding community. Keep up the good work HP RoboCop

Important Facts About the Census

The Census is Safe

- It is illegal to share your census information with anyone including the courts, IRS, police or immigration enforcement.
- Your answers will never be used to decide if you or your family receives benefits.
- **There will be no citizenship question.**

Everyone Must be Counted

- Once every 10 years, the census counts EVERYONE living in the U.S. – regardless of age, race/ethnicity or citizenship status.
- It is important that everyone living with you is counted – children, relatives, friends and roommates.

Filling Out the Form is Easy

- You can complete the census online, by mail, or by phone.
- You will be asked 10 simple questions, like your age, if you are married, and the number of children in your home.

Your Family and Community will Benefit

The census helps decide how much money Los Angeles will get for important things like: School, Hospitals, Affordable Housing, Job Programs

Each person counted in the census means more money will go to your community for the next 10 years. Participating in the census means you are claiming your community's fair share of federal money.

This is Your Chance to be Heard

The census also decides how many elected officials L.A. County will send to Washington, D.C.

- Being counted makes sure your voice will be heard.
- It is your chance to safely resist exclusion.

El censo es seguro

- Es ilegal compartir su información con cualquier persona, incluidos los tribunales, el IRS, la policía o los agentes de inmigración..
- Sus respuestas nunca se usarán para decidir si usted o su familia reciben beneficios.
- **No habrá preguntas sobre ciudadanía.**

Todos deben ser contados

- Una vez cada 10 años, el censo cuenta a TODOS los que viven en los Estados Unidos, sin importar la edad, raza/etnia o condición de ciudadanía.
- Es importante contar a todos los que viven con usted: niños, familiares, amigos y compañeros de cuarto.

Completar el formulario es fácil

- Puede completar el censo en línea, por correo o por teléfono.
- Se le harán 10 preguntas simples, como su edad, si está casado y la cantidad de niños en su hogar.

Su familia y comunidad se beneficiarán

El censo ayuda a decidir cuánto dinero obtendrá Los Ángeles por cosas importantes como: Escuelas, Hospitales, Vivienda accesible, Programas de trabajo

Cada persona contada en el censo significa que más dinero irá a su comunidad durante los próximos 10 años. Si usted no es contado, eso significa que su comunidad no recibirá el dinero que merece. Participar en el censo significa que está asegurando la parte justa de dinero federal para su comunidad.

Esta es su oportunidad de ser escuchado

El censo también decide cuántos funcionarios electos enviará el condado de L.A. a Washington, D.C. Ser contado asegura que su voz sea escuchada.

HOTLINE TO REPORT ILLEGAL DUMPING

The City of Huntington Park has created a **HOTLINE** to report illegal dumping. Illegal dumping is any unauthorized disposal of waste on any public or private property. Usually people dump illegally to avoid collection and disposal fees, or because they believe proper disposal is just "too much trouble". State laws specify strict penalties for people convicted of illegal dumping, which may include fines up to \$10,000, seizure of vehicle, and incarceration.

To report an illegal dumping just call the number below and leave a message including as much information as possible regarding the dumped site to help us actively investigate and prosecute this case. Helpful information could include, address, specific location, date and time you witnessed the illegal action, the type and materials dumped, vehicle description, license plate number, physical description of the offender. You have the right to remain completely anonymous, however, leaving your name and contact information is important to successfully investigate the case.

LINEA DIRECTA PARA REPORTAR DESECHOS DE BASURA ILEGALES

La Ciudad de Huntington Park ha creado una línea directa para reportar desechos ilegales de basura. El desechar algo ilegalmente incluye el tirar basura u objetos voluminosos sin autorización en propiedad privada o pública. Usualmente la gente lleva a cabo esta acción ilegal para evitar el pago de cuotas, o porque creen que el hacerlo correctamente les causa mucho problema.

Las leyes del estado de California contienen multas muy estrictas para la gente que sea encontrada culpable de llevar a cabo este acto ilegal, esto puede incluir multas hasta de \$10,000, embargo de su vehículo, y encarcelamiento.

Para reportar un desecho ilegal, por favor deje un mensaje en nuestra línea directa e incluya toda la información que sea posible para ayudarnos a investigar y resolver este caso. Información importante podría ser, la dirección, área específica, día y hora de la acción ilegal que usted vio, el tipo de materiales y la cantidad, una descripción del vehículo, número de licencia y una descripción del transgresor. Usted tiene el derecho de permanecer completamente anónimo, pero el dejar su nombre e información para contactarlo(a) es importante para que investiguemos el caso exitosamente.

Reminder to Properly Dispose of Pet Waste

The City of Huntington Park would like to remind pet owners to properly dispose of pet waste by placing it in a plastic bag and tossing it in the trash. Pet waste contains harmful bacteria that can spread serious disease when it contaminates our water ways. Failure to clean up pet waste on public or private property is a violation of Huntington Park Municipal Code 5-11.13 which results in a minimum fine of \$100 for each infraction. The City of Huntington Park will welcome a new linear park for our residents to enjoy! The Huntington Park Greenway project will bring a brand new 6-acre greenway park-space south of Salt Lake Park between Florence Avenue to the north and Santa Ana Street to the south. This project is made possible through a partnership with the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power and a \$4.7 million grant from the California Natural Resources Agency.

Work is scheduled to begin Spring of 2020.
