City of Huntington Park statement regarding Los Angeles County District Attorney review of the January 26, 2023, officer-involved shooting

HUNTINGTON PARK, CA — The City of Huntington Park acknowledges today's announcement by the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office that criminal charges will not be filed against the Huntington Park police officers involved in the January 26, 2023, officer-involved shooting of Anthony Lowe.

The District Attorney's Office issued its determination following a comprehensive, independent review that included an extensive factual and legal analysis of the incident. In its findings, the District Attorney concluded that the evidence did not support the filing of criminal charges under the applicable legal standard and determined that the officers' actions could not be proven beyond a reasonable doubt to be unlawful under California law.

"This review reflects a thorough and independent evaluation of the facts, evidence, and applicable law," said Police Chief Cosme Lozano. "As with all officer-involved incidents, this matter was subject to an external review process, and we recognize the importance of that process in ensuring accountability and adherence to the rule of law."

The City notes that the District Attorney's determination is limited to the criminal review and does not affect any civil proceedings related to this matter. The City and the Huntington Park Police Department will not comment further on pending litigation.
