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Executive Summary

BACKGROUND

Congress passed the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act and the President signed it on March 27, 2020 authorizing \$2.2 trillion in a variety of stimulus measures to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the COVID-19 pandemic. The law includes a special allocation of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG-CV) to enable communities to effectively address the impact of COVID-19 on their communities, especially low- and moderate-income residents. This substantial amendment No. 5 to the City's 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan will allocate the City's remaining balance of CV funds. It should be noted that the City's previous substantial amendments that allocated the CDBG-CV funds to activities (Substantial Amendments No.1, No. 2, No. 3, and No. 4) were previously approved by City Council on December 3, 2019 (Substantial Amendment No. 1), May 19, 2020 (Substantial Amendment No. 2), June 11, 2020 (Substantial Amendment No. 3), and April 6, 2021 (Substantial Amendment No. 4)

Proposed Revisions of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG-CV funds)

The Substantial Amendment No. 5, Budget Amounts to CDBG-CV Activities within the 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan, provides the following recommendations:

- Allocation of unencumbered \$318,823.09 CDBG-CV funds to the Keller Park Improvement.

Process

The City's Approved Citizen Participation Plan encourages public participation. The public comment period is available for 30 days.

The review period began on February 5, 2026, and runs through the public hearing regarding the substantial amendment to be held on March 10, 2026. To encourage review and comment on the proposed activities, the City of Huntington Park published a notice advertising the substantial amendment on the City website, and local newspaper. An electronic copy of the amendment was available on the City website and hard copies were made available at the City Administration offices.
