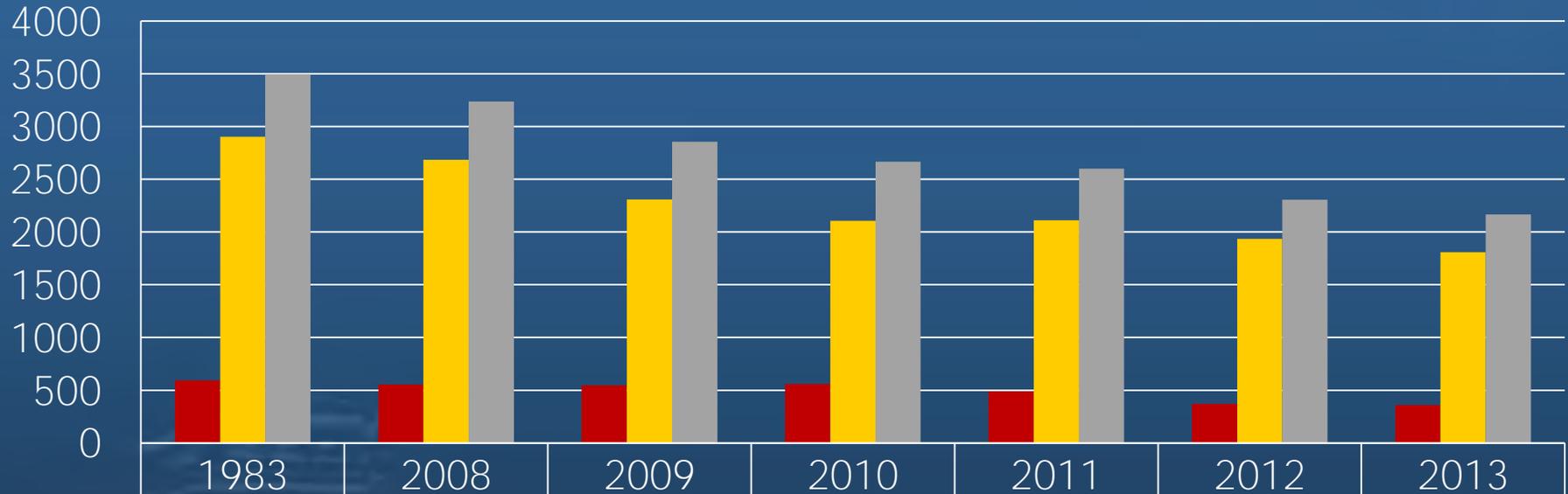

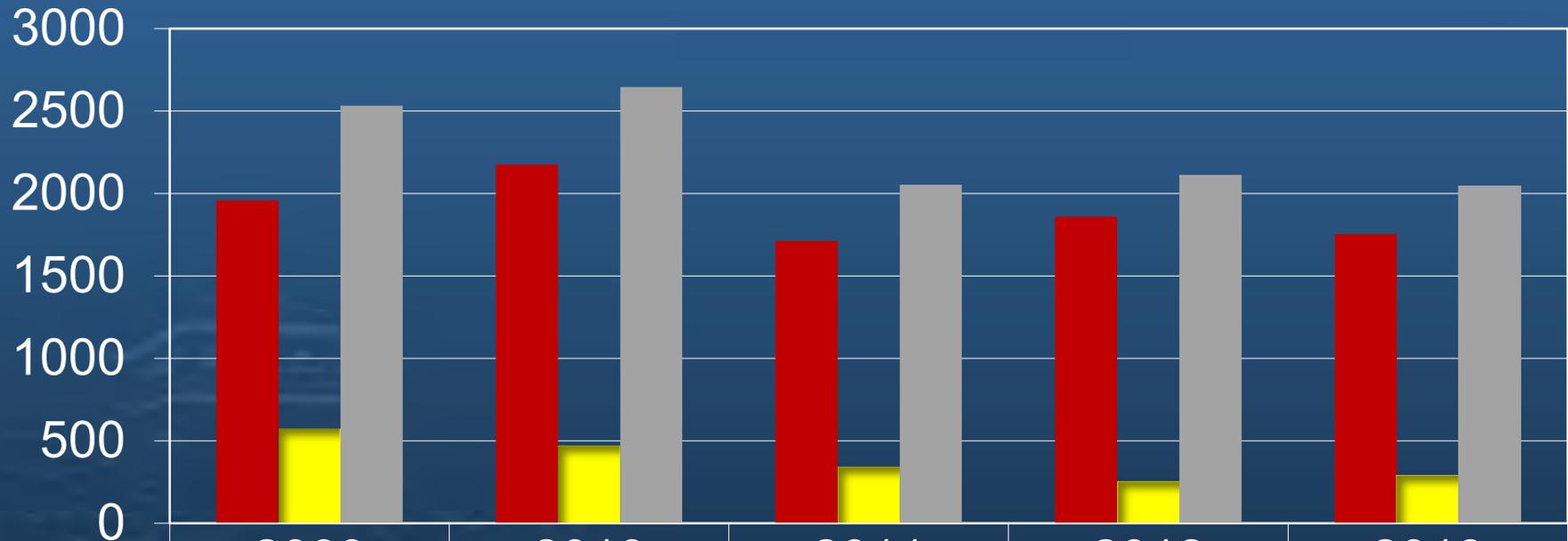

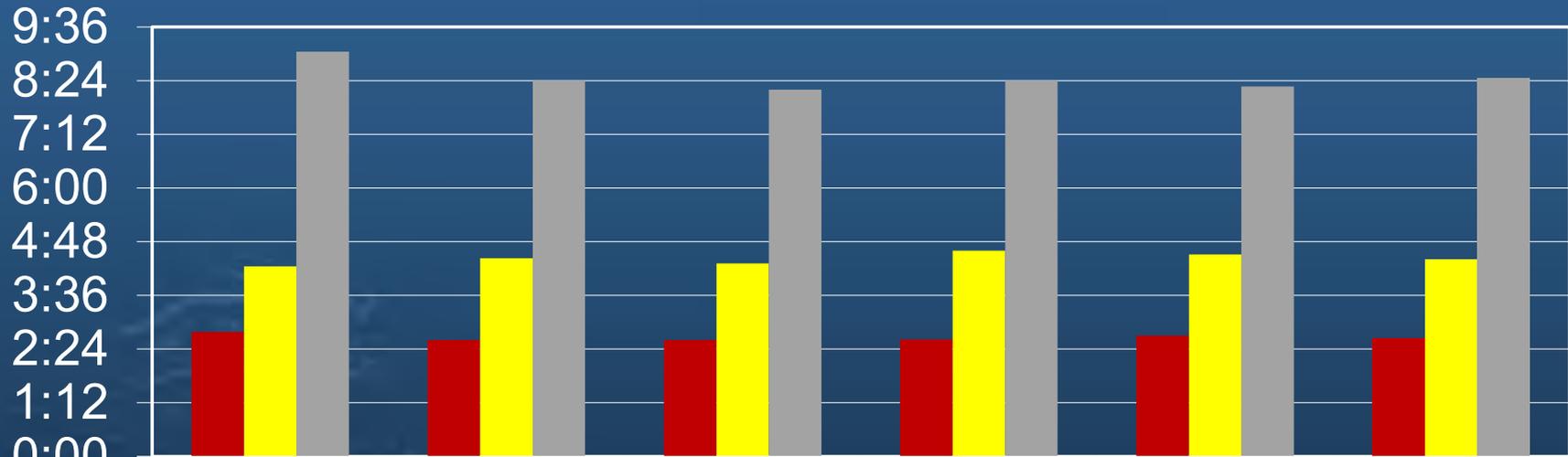


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Response Times

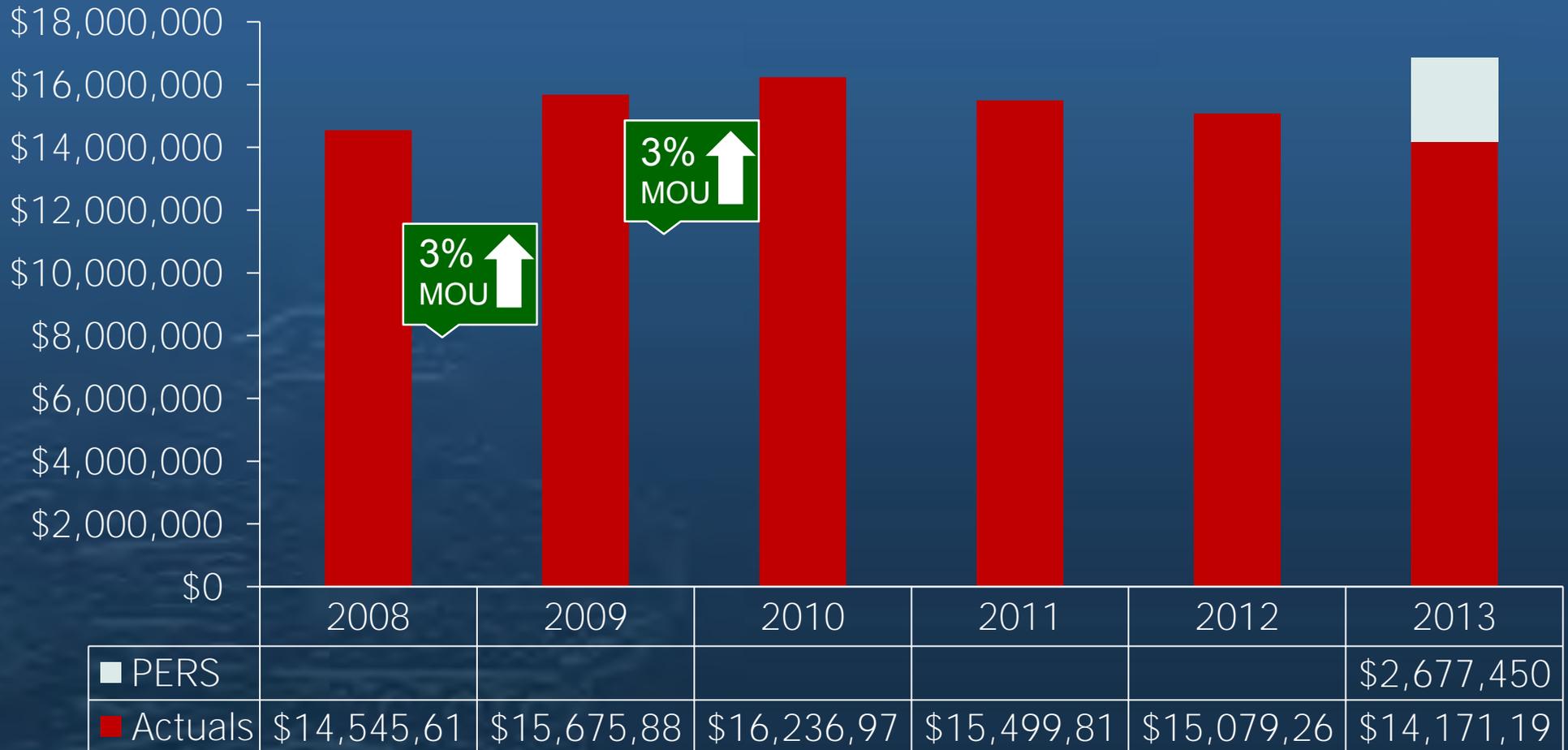


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HPPD General Fund Actuals





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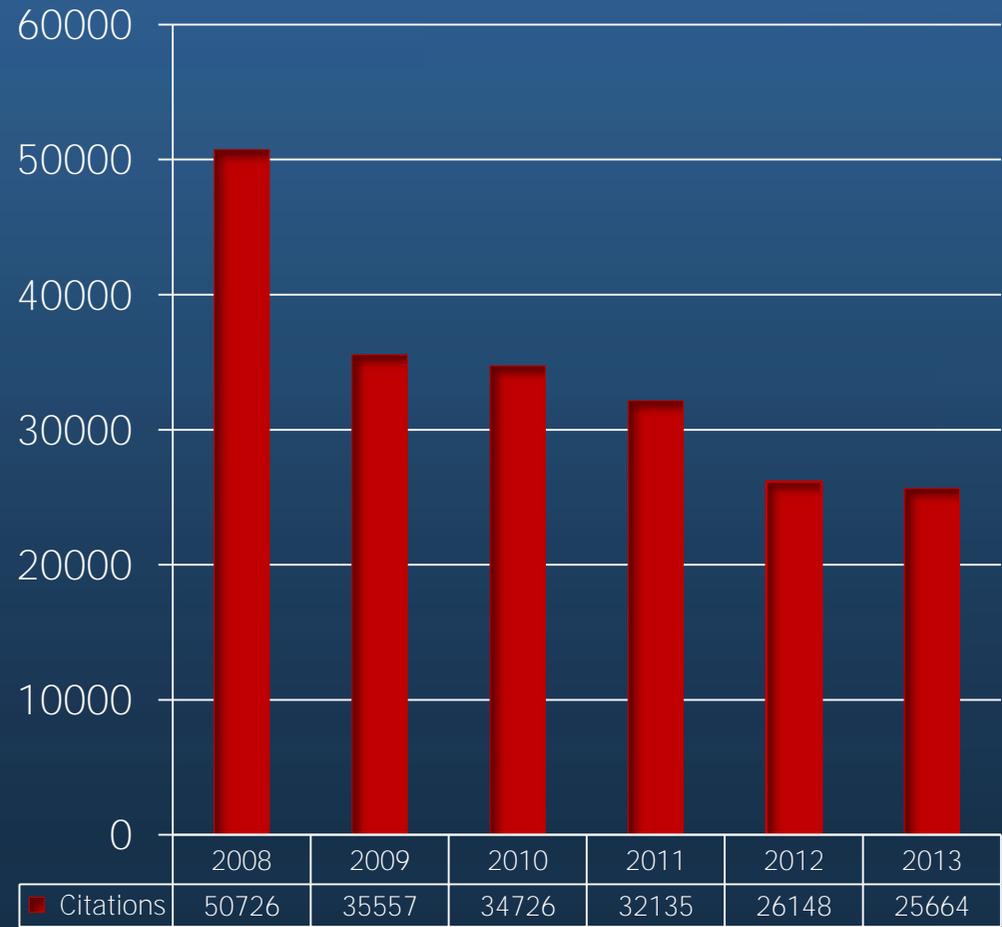
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Parking Meter Revenue

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NEW PROJECTS/PRODUCTS - With no general fund monies

- ALPR technology to improve auto theft reduction efforts and overall crime
- Deal with AB109, realignment, we have dedicated 25% of our gang enforcement unit.
- PD purchased two new motorcycles with a 5 year maintenance package to assist with reducing crime and impacting traffic issues.
- Developed the Mounted Horse Unit for crowd control & as a community partnership tool.
- Purchased crime analysis technology to better place limited resources.
- Equipped all officers with electronic control devices (Tasers) to reduce incidences of injury.
- New automated training and equipment tracking system.
- Installing Field Based Reporting to enhance Officer efficiency and reduce Records input hours.
- Purchased 2 electric & 1 hybrid vehicle for Parking Enforcement reducing fuel & yearly maintenance cost.
- Installing a police wire mesh & camera system to assist with the reduction of crime.
- Developing an electronic time keeping & scheduling system to reduce administrative/supply cost.
- Purchasing (5) new hybrid Investigation vehicles to reduce fuel and annual maintenance cost.
- Employed Phone Tree system to enhance call answering response times.



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2013 FACTS

- HPPD received 86,146 calls
- Approximately 30,236 of which were dispatched after screening
- Communications Division answered 85% of incoming calls within 10 seconds
- 2,043 calls for service resulted in an arrest, 45 (roughly 2.2% of all arrests) involved use of force
- HPPD received 9 complaints, generated both from the community & within the Department
- 18% percent reduction in traffic collision reports compared to 2012 statistics
- Police Volunteers put in 1,938 hours in 2013
- Investigated 3,388 criminal cases
- 62% case clearance rate
- Gang Unit contacted 1,086 identified gang members
- Code Enforcement Unit was assigned 1,248 cases
- Developed procedures for the monitoring of the new AB109/PRCS population
- Held 12 successful DUI Checkpoints to reduce driving under the influence accidents
